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About the Program

The program spans nearly two centuries and features music from England, Scotland, the Scottish Hebrides and Ireland. The mad song Bess of Bedlam can be found in Orpheus Britannicus. The manuscript of Elizabeth Rogers Hir Virginall Booke is in the British Museum. The Handel aria Lascia ch'io pianga includes the ornaments created by Isabella Giradeau from her 1711 London performance. Scottish composer James Oswald drew upon Baroque and Scottish elements in his music. The first three selections are from Colin's Kisses of 1743, and The Maid of Selma is from one of the Bland publications in 1790. Ho ro Mo Chaidil Morag Bheag is an 18th-century Hebridean lullaby. Irish composer Dr. Stevenson wrote The Harp in Softly Pleasing Strains specifically for voice and harp.

About the Artist

Soprano **Zoe Vandermeer** accompanies her singing on *Welsh triple harp*. A graduate of the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, she was named to the Roster of the Connecticut Commission on Culture and Tourism in 2011 and is a recipient of numerous grants. Solo performances include the São Paulo International Harp Festival, International Festival de Deia Spain, American Harp Society, Carnegie Hall, American Swedish Historical Museum, HarpCon2003 Bloomington, Glasgow International Early Music Festival, among other venues. In December 2021, Zoe was a Semi-Finalist in the Premiere Opera Foundation International Vocal Competition, and in January 2022, she was a two-time Bronze Winner in the vocal and classical categories by Global Music Awards. www.sopranoandharp.com

About the Welsh Harp

Zoe Vandermeer's Welsh triple harp was made in 2014 by harpist and harp maker Robin Ward in the UK. It is designed after a harp found at St. Fagan's Museum, Wales. It was intentionally built smaller than a full-size Welsh triple harp, in order to accommodate air travel.
