About the Artists

Violists da gamba John Mark Rozendaal and Adam Young, first performed as a duo in a Midtown Concerts program in January 2019.

John Mark Rozendaal performs on the viola da gamba and the baroque cello with Trio Settecento, Brandywine Baroque and LeStrange Viols.

Adam Young received his Master's degree in viola da gamba from The Juilliard School where he studied with Sarah Cunningham. A finalist in the 2018 Bach/Abel Wettbewerb in Köthen, Adam has performed with many NYC-based early music ensembles as well as concerts in Canada, England, France, Germany, Hungary, Kosovo and Russia.

About the Program

In last year's program Rozendaal and Young drew a dazzling array of colors, textures, tonalities, and affects from their two bass viols in the works of three masterful composer/performers of the seventeenth century. This season the duo ups the ante, offering Martin Davids' masterful transcription of J.S. Bach's Fugue in C-Major from the Sonata III for solo violin. The piece is J.S. Bach's longest fugue, one of his most exciting, challenging, and beloved works.
